5. a. Management practices
- Evaluated each stripping application to ensure there is a need for paint stripping. (e.g. Is it possible to re-coat without removing the existing coating.)
  - Evaluated each stripping application to ensure there is no alternative paint stripping technology that can be used. (e.g. Non methylene chloride strippers, or mechanical stripping.)
  - Reduce exposure of all methylene chloride strippers to the air.
  - Optimize application conditions to reduce methylene chloride evaporation. (e.g. If heating stripper, making sure temperature is kept as low as possible to reduce evaporation.)
  - Practice proper storage and disposal of methylene chloride strippers. (e.g. Store strippers in closed, air tight containers.)
- b. Is methylene chloride usage at a single stripping operation more than one ton per year?
