





Steps to Starting a 4-H Club

Read the job description for a 4-H club leader: https://go.ncsu.edu/forsyth4hleader

If that sounds like the job for you:

- Enroll in 4-H Online https://v2.4honline.com/
 - o Review this document for help enrolling

 $_{\odot}$ Be sure to submit your application, complete the "Screening" section and the watch the "Training" video in its entirety

• NC Cooperative Extension, Forsyth County Center will conduct reference checks

• NCSU will send you an email from: <u>CustomerService@infomart-usa.com</u> with a link for you to complete a criminal background check - <u>see more information here</u>

• If approved, volunteer must participate in orientation and training

• Determine another Forsyth County 4-H Volunteer to start the club with you: either connect with an existing Forsyth 4-H Volunteer or encourage another potential Forsyth 4-H Volunteer to complete the process

• Determine a safe, consistent meeting location

• Market 4-H Club interest through flyers, informational nights, etc. (N.C. Cooperative Extension helps with this!)

• Work with community partners to identify potential 4-H members (minimum of 5 youth) between the ages 5-18 (typically ages 5-8, 9-12 and 13-18 go well together for programming; you decide which age group to work with)

• Help youth complete online 4-H application at https://v2.4honline.com/

• Club leader meets with youth to determine a 6-month plan of work, including a minimum of one community service project, per calendar year (Jan.1-Dec.31)

- Youth vote on a non-discriminatory name for the 4-H club
- Elect club officers (unless the youth are 5-8 years old)
- Submit required forms to 4-H Office ask your Agent which forms need to be submitted: <u>https://go.ncsu.edu/4hclubpaperwork</u>

• Submit a monthly report online - once approved, you will receive a monthly reminder from the 4-H Staff
